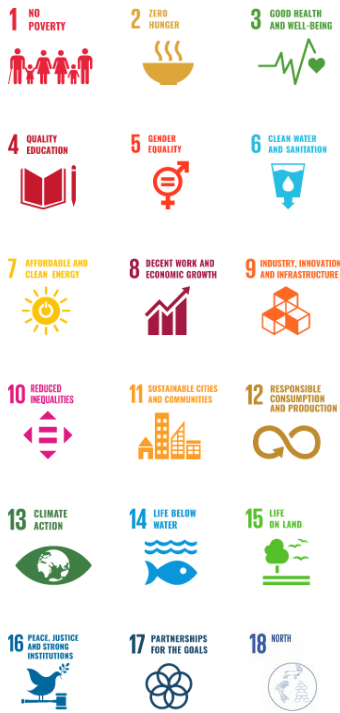




United Nations Association in Canada

Established in 1946, UNA-Canada was a founding member of the World Federation of United Nations Associations and today holds the elected Vice-Chair, representing global civil society.

Generation SDG

Generation SDG activates civic engagement through the creation of youth-led service initiatives related to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Implemented through partnerships with District School Boards and other youth-serving organizations, 60 diverse youth, aged 15-25 years, take action to address issues they have identified in their local communities, contributing to the advancement of the 2030 Agenda and the achievement of the SDGs. Guiding the development of service initiatives, youth participate in four experiential training retreats and access
